## Look Who's Cooking

Danielle Gribble, Way Library Page, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." This recipe is a family favorite and easy to make. It is sure to become a favorite and often-requested meal for your family, too. Enjoy!



### One-Dish Chicken & Rice Bake

1 can of cream soup (delicious with cream of celery, cream of chicken, or cream of mushroom)

1 cup water

$\frac{3}{4}$  cup uncooked regular rice

¼ tsp. paprika  
¼ tsp. pepper  
2-4 boneless chicken breasts  
1 can of vegetables, drained - any kind  
Shredded cheddar cheese

1. Spray a 2-quart shallow baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
2. Mix soup, water, rice, paprika, pepper, and vegetables and place in baking dish. Top with chicken breasts.
3. Season with additional paprika and pepper. Cover pan.
4. Bake at 375° for 50-60 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle with shredded cheese.

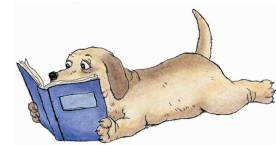

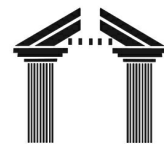

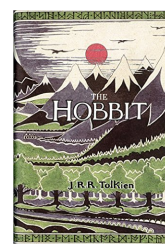
