November 11, 2018 is the one-hundredth anniversary marking the end of World War I. Not so incidentally, it's also Veterans Day, originally Armistice Day being the day the Armistice was signed in 1918 to end what was then referred to as the "Great War."



To help commemorate this historic event, The Perrysburg Area Historic Museum and Way Library will present the program "Perrysburg Played Its Part in World War I." The guest speaker is Richard Baranowski, Way Library Local History Librarian, who will talk about Perrysburg's role in the war, including stories about some of our local "doughboys."

The program will be held Sunday, November 11 at 2:00pm in Way Library's lower level auditorium.
