Additional Option being Offered through Overdrive

Way Public Library has expanded its digital collection with the addition of OverDrive Periodicals. This new collection features 40 popular digital magazines including National Geographic, Reader's Digest, Good Housekeeping, and ESPN The Magazine.

Patrons may check out periodicals on the same OverDrive digital library website where they currently borrow eBooks, digital audiobooks, streaming video titles, and music at http://ohdbks.lib.overdrive.com. All that is required is a valid library card and a NOOK or Barnes and Noble account. Titles can be read via a NOOK tablet device or Free NOOK Reading App available for a multitude of smartphones, tablets, ereaders, and PCs.
