Women and Islam on March 16

The Topical Tuesday program on March 16 will address a fascinating topic, "Women and Islam." Islamic scholar **Dr. Fatima Agha Al-Hayani** will be the speaker at this free event which begins at 7 p.m. Women's rights, divorce, the Veil, and polygamy are some of the issues which will be addressed.

Dr. Al-Hayani has a Ph.D. in Near Eastern Studies from the University of Michigan. She concentrated on Islamic Law, Family Law, and Near Eastern History, Society and Culture, Modern Arabic Literature and Methodology in Foreign Language Instruction.

As well as serving as a consultant and expert witness on Muslim family law, including marriage, divorce and custody, Dr. Al-Hayani has taught a wide variety of courses at the University of Toledo. She has authored publications on Arabs and the American legal system and the

Census and Redistricting, April 27

The League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area (LWVPA) and Way Library will join forces to present a April 27 Topical Tuesday program on the **2010 Census and Redistricting.** Beginning at 7 p.m., this program anticipates some of the issues involved in carving out new Ohio Congressional districts after the new census is completed. The League supports a fairer and more transparent redistricting procedure than the current winner-takeall system.

Guest speakers will be **Margarita De Leon**, a partner-ship specialist with the U.S. Census Bureau, and **Anne Nelson** of the LWV State Association. Ms. De Leon will talk about what is happening with the census in north-west Ohio, and Ms. Nelson will present information on the models that won the recent Ohio Redistricting Competition. This contest, launched by the Ohio LWV and other entities in March 2009, was initiated to open the process of redistricting and use objective criteria to produce fair legislative districts.

On Thursday, April 15, at 7 p.m. Ms. Hagedorn will talk about her 2002 book "Beyond the River: the

Untold Story of the Heroes of the Underground Railroad." This book tells the dramatic story of the Ripley, Ohio, line of the Underground Railroad. Abolitionist, Presbyterian minister and farmer John Rankin and his fellow abolitionists along the Ohio River guided slaves to freedom despite great personal hardship and danger.

Ms. Hagedorn moved from New York City to Ripley to research this book. She has written for the Wall Street Journal, the San Jose Mercury News and the Washington Post. She has taught at Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism and Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism. She is the author of "Wild Ride: The Rise and Tragic Fall of Calumet Farm, Inc." and "Ransom: the Untold Story of International Kidnapping." She now lives in Ripley and in Chicago, Illinois.
