

WAY TO WORK WITH AREA LIBRARIES IN 'BIG READ'

The Toledo-Lucas County Public Library announced this week that it has received a major National Endowment for the Arts grant to participate in **The Big Read** this fall. This national initiative is designed to restore reading to the center of American culture. Way Library will collaborate with TLCPL by holding a book discussion and movie showing here in Perrysburg.

Community members are invited to read Harper Lee's "To Kill a Mockingbird." Author and Toledo native P.J. O'Rourke will speak on September 24, followed by Charles Shields, author of "A Portrait of Harper Lee," on September 25-26. Tentatively, Way plans to hold a discussion on Thursday, September 27, and show the film on Friday, September 28.

MAIN STREET APPLICATION INITIATED BY PARTNERS

Way Library will partner with Perrysburg downtown merchants and others in applying to become an Ohio Main Street community.

Main Street Perrysburg, Inc., will be created as a non-profit organization dedicated to the continued revitalization of downtown Perrysburg. Its mission will be to stimulate economic vitality and to improve the visual appearance and the quality of life in downtown Perrysburg by promoting it as a great place to live, work, shop and invest.

If the application to the Heritage Ohio

Main Street Program is successful, the new non-profit entity will receive assistance and training to implement the National Trust for Historic Preservation's Main Street Center Four-Point Approach. The four areas are organization, promotion, design and economic restructuring.


A Heritage Ohio Main Street Downtown Assessment Resource Team (DART) visit on June 9-10, 2005, resulted in a 39-page assessment of Perrysburg's weaknesses and strengths, including "a wonderfully renovated library...the centerpiece of downtown. Great use of new architecture blended with original building structures."

Karen Morley Khan Concert Series launched, piano dedicated in April

Way Library honored the memory of Karen Morley Khan during a special concert Friday, April 27, on the main floor of the library.

Karen Morley Khan, 1938-2001, lived in Perrysburg from 1964 until her death from cancer in 2001. She was married to Nasr Khan for 19 years. Because of her great love of music—singing, playing the piano, teaching dance— a fund was created by Karen's family to support musical endeavors at Way Public Library through the library's Foundation. This support has allowed the library to add numerous items to our collection as well as launch a concert series. A new piano was dedicated at this event.

Front Porch Oral History Series has interviewed 50+ area residents

In June 2002, when Way Library local history librarian Richard Baranowski embarked upon his first Front Porch Oral History Series interview with Franklin and Paul Kazmaier and Bob Thomas, little did he know that five years later, he still would be behind the camera asking questions about old-time Perrysburg to any area resident he can talk into participating. Recently, Mr. Baranowski completed his landmark 50th interview. Then he added 51 and 52, just to stay in stride. An abbreviated transcript of each interview is printed in the Perrysburg Messenger Journal, and video copies of the interviews are given to the participants as well as added to the library's collection. Visit the library's Local History Room to see the tapes that are available for circulation. The tapes are a treasure trove of memories about early Perrysburg. Through these recollections of our early days, step back and experience village life 50-100 years in the past.
