Halloween Garland

Supplies Needed:

- Halloween shapes print outs (bat and ghost)
- Orange & black cardstock
- Book pages (4)
- Twine (6 feet)
- Glue
- Scissors
- Pencil






Step 1: Cut out the bat and ghost shapes to use as stencils. You can also use them as part of the garland once you are done tracing.



Step 2: Trace, cut and layer your ghosts and bats any way you choose! When creating a back layer, remember to trace the outline larger than the stencil. Each book page has enough space for two shapes. Glue the layers together.









Step 3: Personalize your ghosts and bats - decorate them or add details like eyes. You can also fold them to

give some movement.







Step 4: There are many options for attaching your cutouts to the twine.


 Punch two holes on each shape and feed the twine from the front so that it does not block your shape. Or use one hole and cut a small piece of twine to create a loop to hang.

• Simply tape the twine across the back of your shapes.

Use glue to attach the twine to the cutout. A stronger hold would be to glue the twine between the layers (at the end of step two).

 Attach your cutouts to the twine with mini clothes pins for a fun touch! They can also be decorated to add more festive flare.
